E-Safety Rules for KS2

- We ask permission before using the internet
- We only use apps and websites that an adult has chosen
- We tell an adult if we see anything we are uncomfortable with
- We immediately close any webpage we are not sure about
- We only message people an adult has approved
- We send messages and attachments that are polite and friendly
- We never give out personal information or passwords
- We never arrange to meet people who we don't know that we have only met online
- We do not share passwords with other people.
- We do not open messages sent by anyone we don't know.
- We do not use internet chat rooms
- We make sure that anything we write cannot be mistaken for cyber bullying
