What is classification?	A category into which something is put.
What is a microbe?	A living creature that is so small you can't see.
What are three examples of micro-organisms	Viruses, fungi, bacteria, algae, protozoa and archaea.
What is a cell? What does multicellular mean and unicellular?	A cell is the basic structural and functional unit of life. Multicellular contains many cells. Unicellular is one cell.
Why are viruses not considered living things?	Viruses are not made out of cells, they can't keep themselves in a stable
	state, they don't grow, and they can't make their own energy
What is an example of a disease caused by bacteria?	Tuberculosis, salmonella
What is an example of a disease caused by a virus?	Measles, smallpox, Ebola
Who is Carl Linnaeus?	Pioneer of classification.
What is an invertebrate?	An organism with no spinal cord
What is an arthropod?	An invertebrate with a hard, external skeleton and jointed limbs
What are the four types of arthropod?	Insects;
	myriapods (including centipedes and millipedes);
	arachnids (including spiders, mites and scorpions);
	Crustaceans (including slaters, prawn and crabs).
What are insects?	Arthropods with 6 legs, a head, a thorax, an abdomen. Most insects also have antennae and a pair of wings
What are examples of insects?	Dragonfly, beetles, green bottles, bees
What is an arachnid?	A arthropod with 8 legs no wings and no antennae
What are examples of arachnids?	Spiders, scorpions, Japanese spider crabs
What is a crustacean?	An arthropod with two pairs of antennae
Give examples of crustaceans?	Woodlouse, prawns, shrimp

What is a myriapod?	An arthropod with a flat, long or cylindrical body and more than 8 legs
Give two examples of myriapods?	Centipede and millipede
